A Pictorial Celebration of Morden's Roses

"Coming Up Roses" is a group of activities celebrating the botanical legacy of Dr. Henry Marshall. When some people are lucky, they say their "ship came in." But here in the Morden, we say "Everything's coming up roses," and we think how lucky we were to have Dr. Marshall as a resident. To honour his legacy and capture a present day representation of our cultural heritage, the Chautauqua Spirit "Coming up Roses" Photographic Competition is using the "Parkland Roses" as the theme for the competition.

The twelve best submissions will be chosen and displayed at our Chautauqua Celebrations, September 26-28, 2008.

- These 12 submissions may be reproduced into a 2009 calendar and sold as a fundraiser for a local organization.
- Photo credit will be given to selected images
- The winning submission displayed at the Chautauqua Spirit Celebration may be reproduced and or donated back to be auctioned off as a fundraiser for a local organization.
- The committee will not sell any image to outside sources for profit

Theme:

Images should depict garden variety floral celebrations of the Parkland roses. Acceptable subject photos may include a single rose; close up, group or variety of roses in a garden setting. No people in the image. Black and white (unconverted) photos will be accepted.

Contest Rules

1. Competition open to all amateur photographers of any age
2. Entrants under the age of 18 must have the entry/release form signed by a parent or guardian and their signature must be witnessed.
3. All entrants will compete at the same level
4. Entrants may submit up to 2 entries
5. Judging will be based on adherence to the theme and overall composition
6. Entries must be submitted by 5:00 p.m. on August 16, 2008 to the Pembina Hills Arts Gallery.
7. All entries will be available for pick up following the judging and selection of winners at the Pembina Hills Arts Centre during regular gallery hours.

Print Images

8. All entries must be submitted as an unframed 8" X 10" print **and** a digital copy of the print on CD no less than 8" X 10" at 300 dpi must be included.
9. Photographs must be the original work of the competitor
10. photographs must be taken in 2008
11. Digital enhancement of the photo is allowed to only include cropping, straightening and color correction. No artwork allowed.
12. All prints must have the competitors name, address, email, phone number and Image file number on a label attached to the BACK of the print **and** CD must be clearly labelled with the same information
13. No identifying marks may appear on the front of the image
14. Images submitted cannot be submitted to another competition.
15. Failure to comply with contest rules and regulation may result in disqualification of photograph entry

Selection

16. Artistic fees will be paid to the top 12 submissions (1st - \$300; 2nd - \$200; 3rd - \$100; 4th – 12th - \$25)
17. Entrant participants must complete and sign the entry form and release giving the Chautauqua Spirit Committee all rights to reproduce the digital submission for promotion, fundraising and any other use needed by the Committee. This form must be attached to the entry.
